

Keeping Dogs Off Your Lawn:

Trv this simple method: Mix 1 part cayenne pepper to 10 parts of water into a spray bottle. Spray lightly over lawn. Dogs tend smell before doing their business. You can also sprinkle cayenne ground pepper around the mailbox posts or small shrubs. This will discourage dogs from spending time near these objects. Reapply cayenne pepper after every rain.

Constantly Improving Our Community

Your Board of Directors is constantly looking for ways to improve and add amenities to make Brentwood Hills an even more desirable neighborhood to live in for our residents.

Some of the active improvement projects include:

- New sod has been added along Brentwood Hills Blvd. Austin Outdoor, our land-scape contractor, is working hard to get the sprinkler system running efficiently in that area.
- The refurbish of all the interior monuments has been completed and new plantings are being installed to complete

the job.

On the list of upcoming projects, the board of directors is looking at building a grill area and pavilion with tables just outside the pool area next to Child Haven to enhance parties and family get-togethers. We have requested bids and hope to begin work on this project in the fall.

The final projects currently planned include completely refurbishing the pool and all its equipment this fall. Additionally, both pool bathrooms will receive new tile and upgraded fixtures, and a new pool-side shower will be added.
